

BACKGROUND

Kenya hosts estimated 10% of the worlds elephant population (in the Year 2021 elephant population in Kenya was 36,280 individuals)

Elephant poaching has also reduced from a high of 384 cases in 2012 when poaching was its peak to a record low of 11 in 2020, the lowest ever in Kenyan history.

Amboseli ecosystem holds 1,900 which is 5.2% of the Kenyan elephant population.

- The African elephant is the world's largest land mammal.
- An "emotional & intelligent" species with feelings, compassion and self-awareness.
- Elephants present tremendous challenges for their successful conservation (Large size, feeding behavior and mobility)
- An "umbrella" species, whose protection provides collateral security for overall biodiversity & tourism industry.
- A "conflict" species.
- An "engineer" species, capable of modifying habitats to the benefit or detriment of different plant and animal species on a local or wider scale.



 Annually there is a conservation deficit of Kshs. 1billion and this gets worse in situation when we have pandemics

Mobilize resources by setting up an elephant resource mobilization scheme that will secure more space for elephant, technology and provision of water.

2021 Magical Tembo Naming Festival

Magical Kenya Tembo Naming Festival was the country's highlight in 2021. Being the first ever in Kenya, this festival attracted more than 25 international and local media with sponsors from as far as North America. The 27 selected elephants were adopted and named by both individuals and corporates.

In 2021, the event raised Kshs. 16 Million which will go towards drilling of two boreholes, rehabilitation of three boreholes and De silting of two water pans in Amboseli ecosystem.



2020 and 2021 saw a massive increase in Amboseli's elephant population, with the birth of 236 calves in total. The population continues to be closely monitored.

In 2021 First Edition, 21 baby elephants were named.

2022 Second Edition naming ceremony will target the remain 215 calves.

Elephants have close family bond and you will normally see them in large family goups. In Africa a basic family consist of 6 to 10 elephants. The family is ruled by a matriach (older female)
